### Youth Orchestra Program

- Sinfonietta members may audition for the Symphony at the June auditions or the fall make up auditions. If a student chooses to audition for the Symphony in the fall, that student must still audition in June for the Sinfonietta. The deposit will be credited to the appropriate tuition rate (Symphony or Sinfonietta) in the fall. Sinfonietta members who wish to audition for the Symphony must prepare the Symphony Audition Requirements listed below.
- There will be a \$25 deposit to reserve your place. The deposit will be credited towards next year's tuition cost. The deposit will be forfeited if the student withdraws prior to the season begins.
- Seating and 'chairs' for both the Symphony and Sinfonietta will be auditioned in the fall. Chamber Ensembles will be established at that time. Dates to be announced.

- **Tell A Friend:** For all current YO Members.

Have a friend or acquaintance audition for the YO program. If they are accepted, you will receive an \$25 credit on next year's tuition. The friend or acquaintance must mention your name when they make an audition appointment.

# Youth Symphony (Advanced Full Orchestra) Winds/Brass/Percussion

## 1. Scales

Typically, students accepted into the youth symphony are familiar with all 12 scales and arpeggios.

Able to play all scales including chromatic (at least 2 octaves)  
All scales and arpeggios are to be MEMORIZED.

## 2. Solo or Etude – preferably grade 4 or higher.

Percussion students should play a snare drum and a mallet piece. Percussion students may also be asked to demonstrate timpani tuning.

Students should perform a solo or etude that best demonstrates their ability, musicality and technical facility. Students wishing to participate in Youth Symphony should demonstrate good rhythm, good intonation, and solid technique. Students should also strive for good tone, phrasing, and musicality in their selected solo or etude.

## 3. Excerpt

Students will perform the assigned excerpt. All excerpts will be posted and made available concurrently. Excerpts will be accessible from the Symphony web page [www.swflso.org](http://www.swflso.org). Please print the appropriate pdf excerpt for your instrument.
