Cellist Scott Crowley, a member of the SWFL Symphony Orchestra, will be our musical feature for November's Luncheon. Scott, a cellist of all styles, has played in various orchestras, operas, musicals and even rock bands throughout the country. Scott started playing the cello at age 6 and nurtured his talent

through attending various summer festivals and music camps, including the prestigious Young Artist Orchestra at Boston University's Tanglewood Institute. He completed his musical training at the University of Cincinnati College -Conservatory of Music and then at the University of South Florida. In addition to his classical background, Scott has performed with numerous well-known rock bands and performers including Kansas, Little River Band, Blood, Sweat and Tears, Mannheim Steamroller, Andrea Bocelli, Il Divo, Johnny Mathis, Mary Wilson, Frank Sinatra, Jr., Tito Puente, Jr., and many more.

Scott has over 15 years of private teaching experience and regularly writes blogs about cello technique. His mission is to make classical music more accessible to young people. He often composes his own arrangements for cello and is currently recording some of his favorite works for cello.


