



WHO WAS MARILYN VAN SICKLE?

The Symphony Society organizes the Marilyn Van Sickle Vocal Music Scholarship competition being held on February 5. Voice students compete for one of two potential four-year scholarships for music study, one \$3,000 each year, and one \$2,000. But WHO WAS Marilyn Van Sickle?

Our archives reveal that Marilyn Van Sickle was a mezzosoprano who graduated from Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York. A native of Elkhart, Indiana, she taught voice and choir in the school system there. She also taught voice at Ward Belmont Junior College in Nashville, Tennessee, and was a soloist with the Nashville and Indianapolis Symphony Orchestras, where she sang both opera and oratorio work. In Fort Myers, she was a member of the Southwest Florida Symphony Chorus.

Upon her death, Ms. Van Sickle established the Joseph L. and Marilyn R. Van Sickle Vocal Scholarship Fund of \$50,000, for the purpose of this scholarship. The Fund is now part of the SWFL Symphony Endowment Fund and has grown through careful stewardship to now yield these two valuable scholarships.

Students vying for the scholarships will perform for 10 minutes each before three eminent judges. Many Society members are helping to make this a successful day, but all Society members are invited to sit in on the competition at Cypress Lake Presbyterian Church between 9:00 and noon, to witness and enjoy the talent of these young vocalists.


