





#### JILLIAN PRESCOTT MUSIC AWARDS

This scholarship competition, which honors the memory of the late very dedicated Society member Jillian Prescott, is funded by a memorial fund with The Collaboratory (formerly the Southwest Florida Community Foundation). (Our thanks to our member Dick Prescott for his support of this fund and our participation.) The Symphony Society organizes and produces the ambitious program of auditions for young musicians between the ages of 12 and 22 (divided into two age groups). The young musicians compete in one of five music disciplines: keyboard, strings, woodwind & brass, percussion, and voice. In prior years there have been as many as 50 students competing for the cash prizes in each category, with the total distributed each year close to \$10,000.


After a hiatus of two years because of the pandemic, we are holding the Prescott Competition on Saturday, April 16, at FGCU's Bower School of Music. The auditions are scheduled in groups by musical discipline and begin at 9:00 a.m. and proceed with minimal breaks until 5:00 p.m. A team of Society members is assisting in this event, but all Society members and friends are invited to come and listen to these young artists perform. You will be amazed at the talent in our community! It is FREE, and no reservation is needed. Just come by and enjoy!
