# 2021 Summer Orchestra Camp



The Southwest Florida Symphony's Education Director, Kara Griffith, was pleased to offer an intensive, week-long summer orchestra camp for the first time in mid-July for intermediate and advanced-level string and wind players. To keep it fresh and fun, students were divided into different groups each day- by age, last name, instrument played, and gender, with an opportunity to also join regularly throughout the day for full rehearsals. Kara's goal was to provide quality symphonic training and performance experience for young musicians in the Lee County area in a fast-paced, fun and safe environment. Ideally located at our Bell Tower center, with generous space-sharing from our neighbor and partner, Artsemble Underground, the results exceeded all expectations!

Kara invited daily guest clinicians in to keep the students interested and engaged, and was delighted to host favorite local conductors including Christi Witte, Roland Forti, Rochelle Maybrich, and Kayla Lisa. They all brought a sense of fun, high energy, and love of music to their sessions. Daily dress-up themes like Tie-Dye and Career Day kept them laughing,



and a masterclass every morning allowed every interested student the chance to perform a solo for our conductors, Katrina Rozmus and Nathan Fish, for instructional feedback with our student audience observing. And the final concert on Friday afternoon, after only five days of

working together, was memorable and amazing!



Students brought their own bag lunches each day (thanks to partner, The United Way, for the refrigerator donation!), or pre-purchased a boxed lunch delivered daily from another of our Bell Tower partners, Burntwood Tavern. Our new Grants & Communications Manager, Emer Olivarez,

The tuition cost of \$350, while fair, was prohibitive to several attendees, who benefitted greatly from the Symphony Society's kind contribution of \$1000. 



# CREDIT CARD, CASH OR CHECK?



## **DID YOU REALIZE?**



BUT the Society, like every other business that accepts credit cards, pays a processing fee of 3.5% plus a 15 cent fee per transaction for each and every charge it processes? That amounts to \$1.03 every time a \$25 amount is charged, such as for our luncheons. Although that seems like a very small amount, it does add to the cost of each lunch served. We have tried to keep our cost to members at \$25.00, but the gracious clubs that we enjoy so much are now charging us as much as \$25.00 per person for our meal and service. This is realistic when their food and labor costs have skyrocketed in the past two years. The Society has other costs for each luncheon that it continues to underwrite without passing them through to luncheon attendees. Reluctantly, the Society Board of Directors has decided to add a small service charge to all charged amounts.

Effective at our April 2021 luncheon meeting, any charge amount for the luncheon will have a \$1.00 Service Charge added. The luncheon price remains \$25.00, and payment by cash or check will remain \$25.00. When a charge card is used, the cost will be \$26.00.

We ask for your understanding about this necessary step.
