
In addition to featuring a world renowned guest violinist at Masterworks 1, we will celebrate our Board President, Tom Uhler's "21st birthday - the sequel!" If you've ever considered joining Conductor's Circle Club, this would be the year to do it. You'll get an invitation to Tom's birthday celebration in the President's Club at BBMann where you can celebrate with all of us; Maestro Paponiu, our guest artists, board of trustees and Who's Who of Southwest Florida, all year. If you're interested in learning more, shoot me an email and I'll be happy to provide additional information.

And now, a challenge: Did you know that most of our musicians, more than 70% of them, travel from outside of Southwest Florida to perform with us? This is how we deliver the highest caliber of professional orchestral music to our community. We import talent from all over the country to achieve the magical sound we create at each and every concert.

Ordinarily, we have dedicated host families for many of them - families who have provided accommodations for our artistic staff for many years. I am among those households. My daughter and I have made lifelong friends with and learned a great deal from the musicians who have stayed with us over the years. Unfortunately, the hurricane has severely damaged many of the homes where our musicians have stayed in the past, which displaces them when they come to Southwest Florida. Right now, I am providing shelter to displaced neighbors who have sustained damage to their property, making their home uninhabitable for the time being. Even hotels where our artistic staff have stayed in the past are at capacity; housing insurance adjusters, contractors and other disaster relief personnel, so hotel rooms are either cost prohibitive or inaccessible to musicians for the foreseeable future. Here's how you can help. If you have a spare/guest bedroom, full guest bathroom and a parking space for one vehicle, providing housing for a member of our orchestra could quite literally save our shows this year. Even if you're unable to provide this assistance in subsequent years, this year, we are in serious need. As a token of our appreciation, we'll be glad to provide those who host musicians with two complimentary tickets to the concert in which the musician you're hosting is performing. Even if you're already a ticket holder, this is a great way to introduce your friends and neighbors to the joy and excitement of our concerts! And who knows? You might also make a lifelong friend like so many of us who host musicians.
